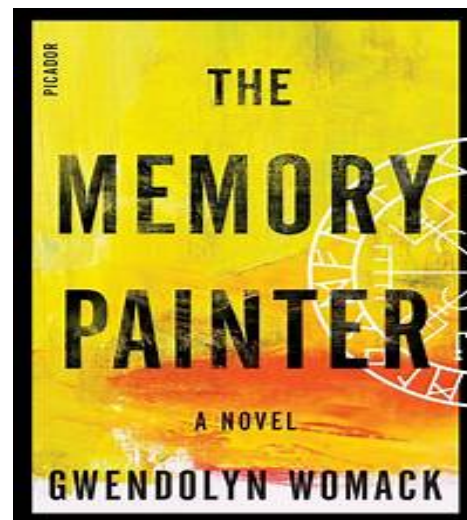

For the November 7, 2017 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Commodore Carrabine.

Keene called roll – the following board members were present at this meeting.

Commodore Carrabine called for the any corrections and or additions to the last board meeting notes (copy attached) (October 3, 2017). Jamie Bevins made a motion to approve the minutes, Scott Ginsburg seconded the motion. The meeting minutes were approved by vote.

Correspondence (Marquiss presented by Keene) – We received 3 pieces of correspondence:

First, a lovely letter from David McCarty dated October 1st regarding Kay McCarty. The letter reads:

'I am writing on behalf of the late McCarty family regarding Kay McCarty. For over 60 years my parents have been member of Lakeside Yacht Club and the memories that our family has forced will forever be in our hearts. With our father passing away over two years ago it is hard to believe how fast time flies by. Our mother has continued to be a member and pay her dues as she is very loyal to the club.

My sisters, Joanne Diane, Carol and I would like you to consider making my mom an honorary member. At age 92 she is starting to be limited in what she can do and it would mean the world to her that Lakeside Yacht Club would bestow this honor to her. We will continue to bring her down and celebrate the regatta and of course the McCarty/Gulden Cup as the (day) is very special to Kay.

Charles Bolton sent an email on November 3rd to Cindy in the office:

Treasurers Report (Hunt) – There was no official report – but the year-end surplus is reported as a little larger than anticipated. Accounts receivable write-offs were lower than expected and we are in good shape this year. The club may reserve dollars for January additional principal payment on the loan.

Since the treasurer described the report as unofficial, no vote was taken to approve the report.

Manager's Report (Orlowski) – Report attached.

Food sales were \$32K in October compared to budget of \$25K. For the fiscal year, food is \$32K ahead of budget. Beverage sales were \$22K in October, \$3.5K more than budget of \$18K. For the year, beverage sales are \$119 behind budget.

It appears that the increased minimums have translated to increased food sales and not increased beverage sales. We will continue to follow this.

The member appreciation party will be December 14th. The club is closed beginning on the 15th but will host three private events after the 14th. The Employee appreciation party will be Wednesday the 20th.

The Club will re-open for 2018 on January 16th.

Harbor Masters Report – (Garland Zimmerman)

Garland Zimmerman presented the Harbor Master's report. There were hearty congratulations – all the boats were out of the water – and given the warm fall weather, most of this work was done in a short period of time. Boats are out, furniture is covered, and the winter hours have begun. Garland and Dan will be around to work on shut down through the end of November. Miguel is here through the end of the week. Garland is compiling a list of projects. Please let Garland know if anyone spots a project to add to the list.

Fleet Captain (Vittardi) – No report.

Committee Reports (Following)

Membership Report (Bevins) –

Jamie Bevins noted that there were a number of resignations.

New Member Application: Jeff Kovach, spent 5 years at Edgewater is looking for a new club. He will start as Social Member, but may move to Senior. John Szabo made a motion to approve the Kovach membership Social application; Dan Lovinger second it. Motion was approved by vote.

The next item was a request for membership abeyance from Mike Bobincheck. Mike has sold his boat, and he may be done with boating altogether, but would like to go into abeyance in case he should change his mind. There was a fair amount of discussion as to the rules regarding abeyance. John Szabo read the actual rules to the members. It was determined by the group that the actual reason for abeyance was not specifically addressed in the rules, and that the rules allowed enough latitude to apply to different situations. Mike Bobincheck is still involved in boating, he works for the Metroparks at the Emerald Necklace Marina and it is entirely possible that he will come back. Dan Lovinger made a motion to allow a one year abeyance. This motion was seconded by Nico Cottone. During discussion, the membership committee recommended that it not be approved. The motion was passed by vote.

The member/guest boater party originally planned for November 11th has been delayed until Spring 2018.

The Cleveland boat show will only be four days next year (Thursday through Sunday). LYC has signed up for a table. More to follow on this event at the next meeting.

Regatta and Sailing Fleet (Ruhlman) – No report.

While no report for the Sailing Fleet, Rob discussed the Interior Decorating project.

The goal of the committee was to lose the sterile “blank canvas” quality in the interior, but in a way that provides maximum flexibility for the interior rooms, and with the most decorating bang for the buck. It has been a several month process, but on January 16th, the club is “locked and loaded” to begin the redecoration.

The bottles are off the top shelf in the bar, providing a better view to the lake. This task had already been completed at the time of the meeting. New shelves for bottles were purchased, freeing up space on the top of the bar.

On the 18th (December), the furniture company will be coming to take the bar stools and bar table chairs back to the shop for recovering. They will be similar to the blue chairs currently in the bar. The decision was made to recover the existing chairs because the furniture and the padding was in good condition, and the cost to recover was less than buying new chairs. Matching the existing blue chairs enables the club to also save money because fewer chairs had to be recovered. The cost for this is \$14,000. However the chairs will now all match each other, and also the existing paint on the walls. The chairs will be gone for the employee holiday party – but Larry has stated they will not be needed. If necessary, chairs from the patio could be used.

The outlets in the bar at the height of the bar TV’s will be lowered to the bead board area. Then the walls will be patched and painted a blue to match the chair covering. The back wall in the bar will be painted and the north wall in the captain’s room will also be painted. Some questioned whether this will be too dark. The white bead board and the light floors should ensure that the room will not be too dark.

Seven rolling cabinets have been ordered at \$450 each. There were 2 cabinets on display at the meeting. These can be rolled where needed, and provide privacy for meetings or events. They can be rolled to the patio or the entrance to the captain’s room. While they are not sound barriers, they do provide privacy and also some much needed storage.

A non-moving cabinet is planned to hide the black curtained area that leads to storage and beverage area in the dining room. The cabinet will be a few feet in front of the opening, even with the wall. The staff will enter from the side of the cabinet. This may have a water feature, but will be an improvement over the black curtain.

The wall in the dining room above the bead board is going to be wallpapered. A large sample was shown to the group. The chosen sample is a commercial grade wallpaper, with fire retardant. It is a blue sea grass pattern. The pattern is not formal, in fact it is a little more casual, but will bring much needed color to the dining room.

The hope is that the work will be done by the time the club opens in January – perhaps a grand opening party could be planned.

The committee has money remaining in its budget, and more ideas. But the committee wants to see how these changes are look before spending the entire budget.

Rules (Szabo) – No Report

Restaurant and Bar (Lovinger) –

The menu now reflects winter type dishes. There are 8 to 10 new menu items. The pork chops are particularly good. This menu will carry the kitchen through April.

There is a comment box sitting in the office. Thus far no comments have been received.

Entertainment Committee (Wolf) – Commodore Carrabine suggested that perhaps we should have some different events – perhaps some new and different events. We're a little stale – It was suggested to find input from club members, for example the women's auxiliary may have ideas. Emory agreed to work on this.

Community Outreach committee (Sparano) – No Report.

Meeting Adjourned –

Dan Lovinger motioned to adjourn, and John Szabo seconded to adjourn the meeting at 18:45 pm. Approved by vote.
